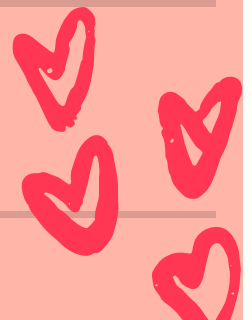

Director of Intrafraternal Relations & Member Development Molly Bruns (pharelations.ku@gmail.com)

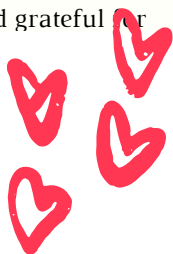
