- Membership Education and Policy Change
  - Bylaw revisions

As previously mentioned in the PHA October Newsletter, the Panhellenic Association Executive Board proposed multiple amendments to the Panhellenic Association Bylaws and Recruitment Policies. Bylaw changes ranged from updating outdated verbiage, realigning and reallocating Panhellenic Officer position duties, adding descriptions and responsibilities to each standing committee, and creating new standing rules. On October 27th, the chapter delegates voted to approve the proposed amendments at a General Assembly (GA) meeting. Blackballed explores the present and historical issues of racism on college campuses and how it ties into today's current state/events.
